

- Start. at Clayton Library & Community Cenre courtyard You can't miss the start sign.
- Stay in the Clayton Library & Community Cenre courtyard Look around the corner.
- Find the fountain -Clayton Library & Community Cenre courtyard.
- Look behind the scrub -Clayton Library & Community Cenre courtyard.
- Sit at the bench, closest to the entrance-Clayton Library & Community Cenre courtyard.
- Stop at the info sign -Clayton Library & Community Cenre walkway.
- Sit at the bench near zebra crossing over-looking the carpark.
- Sit again at the bench after crossing Zebra crossing.
- Look for a poem at the glass entrance of the arcade.
- Search the benches outside the arcade on the Clayton Rd side.
- STOP at the Intersection of Dunstan St and Clayton Rd.
- Cross the road carefully -and search Graffitti laneway.
- Look in the window of the Twosome Story Cafe.
- Find a small poem on the metal pole inside the arcade.
- Sit on the bench outside the Arcade in the carpark area.
- Sit amongst the tress outside the sports centre.
- Follow the poems along the corridor just before entering the library.
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- Sit in the designated seat inside the library.
- Go to Row 19, 798-920 on the book shelves inside the library.
- Complete the journey at -the library information desk.

## HOW IT WORKS

POETRY CORNERS is a public artwork designed to engage men, women and children to learn about and discuss issues of family violence.

This year's Poetry Corners in Clayton was created by 20 residents from the community and performed and translated by a range of people from diverse backgrounds. The Poetry Corners Walk has been made in support of the UN Women's 16 Days of Activism Against Gender-Based Violence.

- PLUG IN YOUR HEADPHONES & begin the walk, following the red numbers on the map.
- DISCOVER the extracts of poems on walls & floors around the village. Click on the red numbers to listen to the poems being recited in full.
- REMOVE your headphones from your ears when crossing at intersections.

- THE WALK will take 20-25 minutes, including reading and listening to the poems.
- **HEAR** the poetic journey entirely online, if you cannot do the walk in person - simply log onto the website.
- SHARE the project with your friends and help us change the story of family violence in our community!
